Information Requested:

Could you please provide me with the details of the survey referenced in your tweet dated 25th October where you referred to a "How are we doing survey"?

Can you please provide details of the survey, including who you surveyed, how you surveyed them and when you conducted this survey?

Information provided for the answer:

Thank you for your recent request for information.

Every two weeks, Public Health Wales, alongside a professional market research company, conducts telephone interviews with hundreds of people aged 18 or over across Wales, to understand how Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) and the measures being used to prevent its spread are affecting the physical, mental and social wellbeing of people in Wales. The survey is part of a raft of measures implemented by Public Health Wales to support public health and wellbeing through Coronavirus.

The data referred to are from week 27 of the survey. Data were collected between 5th and 11th October 2020 from 585 Welsh residents aged 18 years and over. Findings are adjusted to represent national population demographics and

presented in bi-weekly reports. In total, over 10,000 Welsh residents have participated in the survey since April 2020.
